Raymond Engberg, age 72, of Carrington, ND, died Tuesday, May 31, 2016, at Sanford Health of Fargo, ND.

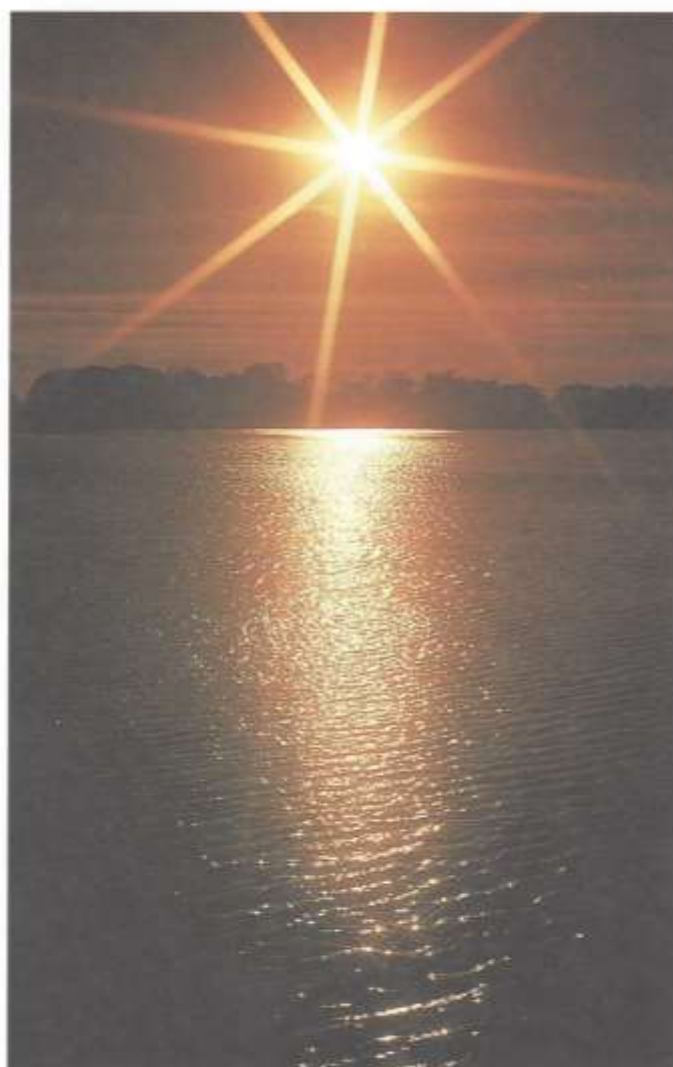
